

JOINT ADMISSIONS AGREEMENT

BETWEEN

SUFFOLK COUNTY COMMUNITY COLLEGE

AND

FARMINGDALE STATE COLLEGE



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AND
FARMINGDALE STATE COLLEGE**

This is a Joint Admissions Agreement between *Farmingdale State College*, located at 2350 Broadhollow Rd., Farmingdale, New York (hereinafter "*Farmingdale State College*" or "*FSC*") and Suffolk County Community College, located at 533 College Road, Selden, New York (hereinafter "*Suffolk County Community College*" or "*SCCC*").

A. Purpose of Agreement

The Joint Admissions Program stipulates the conditions under which students who are granted admission to *SCCC* may also be granted admission to *Farmingdale State College* upon completion of their Associate Degree. The Joint Admissions Program provides students with the opportunity to seamlessly continue their education and complete their baccalaureate degree at *Farmingdale State College*. Through this agreement, students will have the option of selecting one of the following degree programs at the time of their initial admission to *SCCC*.

Note: Program admission requirements may change depending on the semester and year students are admitted through the joint admissions program. Any changes to admissions criteria will be updated through a written addendum to this agreement, signed by both parties.

- Depending on the program selected, students must meet the stipulated requirements above at the time of matriculation at *Farmingdale State College*.
- Students who have been admitted through the Joint Admissions Program will receive a *Farmingdale State College* identification card, providing them access to the *Farmingdale State College* library and campus activities.

- Students who matriculate at *Farmingdale State College* immediately following graduation from *SCCC* will be required to fulfill the selected *Farmingdale State College* program requirements in effect the semester and year they are admitted to the joint program. Any curriculum changes made at either institution after completion of this agreement will be communicated between both institutions and updated through a written addendum, signed by both parties
- *Farmingdale State College* will dedicate a range of scholarship funds and awards to students in the joint admissions program who matriculate as full-time students at *Farmingdale State College*. Each student in the joint admissions program will be automatically considered for grants or scholarship aid based on their academic profile, GPA, intended program of study, and level of need.

B. SCCC County Community College and Farmingdale State College agree to jointly provide the following:

1. *SCCC* and *Farmingdale State College* will each designate appropriate personnel to work with Joint Admissions students at their respective campuses.
2. *SCCC* and *Farmingdale State College* will cooperatively develop publications pertaining to the Joint Admissions Program. Every effort will be made to include a clear and specific explanation of the Program in support of student advisement. These publications should reflect the nature of the agreement and provide information on support services. *Farmingdale State College* will pay for all expenses related to the publication of the joint material.

C. The Joint Admissions Program is open to the following students:

1. Applicants to *SCCC* who will be first-time, matriculated freshmen; OR
2. Transfer applicants to *SCCC* from any accredited institution who will enter *SCCC* with fewer than 24 credits of completed college work (except students who have previously been dismissed from *Farmingdale State College*); OR
3. Any current matriculated *SCCC* student who applies to the Joint Admissions Program prior to the completion of 24 credits of college work.

Students are required to complete the *SCCC* application form available from *SCCC* or local high school guidance offices.

D. Farmingdale State College agrees to provide the following for associate degree holders from Suffolk County Community College who apply for Joint Admissions:

1. Students who have been admitted into the Joint Admissions Program and have paid their *Farmingdale State College* tuition deposit by the appropriate deadline will be

pre-registered and given the same priority in registering for classes as *Farmingdale State College* continuing students.

2. *Farmingdale State College* will consider General Education Requirements as fulfilled by the Associate Degree from SCCC. It should be noted that *Farmingdale State College* has a campus graduation requirement that all students take EGL 102 Composition II: Writing About Literature and earn a C or better. If this course, or its equivalent, has not been satisfactorily completed before matriculation at *FSC*, a student must complete that course at *Farmingdale State College*. Additional General Education courses may also be required as a part of specific program requirements.
3. Students will receive periodic information about activities at *Farmingdale State College* and about their intended program. They will be welcome to visit *Farmingdale State College* to tour the campus, attend academic, cultural, and athletic events, participate in all orientation activities, and/or meet on an individual basis with advisors.
4. *Farmingdale State College* enrollment and tuition deposit information will be forwarded to students in their fourth semester of the SCCC program.
5. Representatives of *Farmingdale State College* will meet at SCCC with students in the Joint Admissions Program on a semester basis. The purpose of these meetings will be to provide information about *Farmingdale State College* curricula and general information about *Farmingdale State College*.
6. *Farmingdale State College* agrees to provide, as needed, information sessions with appropriate faculty and staff of SCCC who will be involved with programs listed in this agreement.
7. Upon request, *Farmingdale State College* will provide to SCCC reports on 1) the number of students who apply and are enrolled, by majors and GPA (personally identifiable information may be redacted) and 2) the continued academic progress of SCCC graduates who continue their studies at *Farmingdale State College* under the terms of this Joint Admissions agreement.
8. *Farmingdale State College* will send a welcoming letter to new jointly admitted students.
9. *Farmingdale State College* will provide opportunities for students to visit the *Farmingdale State College* campus and stay in touch with them throughout their two years at SCCC.

E. Suffolk County Community College agrees to the following:

1. SCCC will list *Farmingdale State College* on the SCCC application as a joint admissions option.

2. During October and February of each year, the Office of Admissions at SCCC will provide *Farmingdale State College* with a list of all students participating in the Joint Admissions Program (new and continuing). SCCC will include their majors, total completed credits, GPA, address, phone numbers and SCCC student email addresses (if available).
3. SCCC will assist in setting up group meetings involving *Farmingdale State College* faculty and staff, and students enrolled in the degree programs listed in this agreement.

F. Articulation for Transfer Students Not Participating in Joint Admissions

Procedures outlined herein relate specifically to students who apply jointly to SCCC and *Farmingdale State College*. Some students upon applying to SCCC may not have decided upon their ultimate educational objective or transfer destination. During the course of their study at SCCC, they may seek to transfer to *Farmingdale State College* upon graduation.

The two institutions agree to make every effort to facilitate transfer of SCCC graduates not covered by the agreement to *Farmingdale State College* by making available to them academic advisement and consultation, just as will be made available to Joint Admissions students. However, it is understood that students not covered by the Joint Admissions Agreement must apply to *Farmingdale State College* for admission in the usual manner of transfer.

G. Term of Agreement

The term of this agreement commences on June 1, 2021 (and terminates in five (5) years, on July 31, 2026. Six (6) months prior to termination, *Suffolk County Community College* and *Farmingdale State College* agree to communicate regarding extending the agreement for an additional five (5) years. This agreement may be modified at any time by the mutual written consent of the parties.


