Transfer Students Holding the Associate Degree

All external transfer applicants to St. John's College of Liberal Arts and Sciences who have been awarded an A.A. or A.S. degree will fulfill the requirements for their baccalaureate in St. John's College of Liberal Arts and Sciences after successfully completing an additional 64 semester hours including, a) six semester hours in Philosophy and six semester hours in Theology; b) the requirements for the selected major concentration; and c) any additional electives needed to reach the 64 credit requirement.

Transfer Students without an Associate Degree or Holding an A.A.S. Degree

A student applying without an Associate Degree will have their credits transferred on a course-by-course basis provided they are applicable to the degree program. Please refer to the course maps provided in this section to assist with transfer planning.
