

Transfer Articulation Agreement
Between
Suffolk County Community College
And
SUNY Buffalo State College

This agreement establishes an agreement between Suffolk County Community College and SUNY Buffalo State College. Matriculating students will, upon completion of the prescribed sequence of courses leading to an associate's degree from Suffolk County Community College, immediately continue their studies in a parallel baccalaureate program at SUNY Buffalo State College with the understanding that they will be given the opportunity to complete all requirements in four semesters of full-time study (15 credit hours per semester) at SUNY Buffalo State College unless otherwise specified by the program of study (see Appendix 1). This assumes the completion of the required credit hours, required grade point average (GPA), and required pre-requisite courses. Section I Application/Admissions Requirements

Students must file a SUNY application <https://www.suny.edu/applysuny/> by February 1st for the summer and fall terms; and by October 1st for the spring term. They must indicate on the application that they expect to receive an A.A./A.S. degree prior to enrollment to SUNY Buffalo State College.

An official copy of the student's transcript from Suffolk County Community College will be submitted to SUNY Buffalo State College Office of Admissions showing at least the equivalent of three semesters of completed study including pre-requisite courses required for entry into the major and the overall grade point average (g.p.a.). Additionally, the student will provide official transcripts from all previous colleges, documentation of advanced credit, an official high school transcript, and/or other supplemental application material to SUNY Buffalo State College as requested.

Admission requirements into the major must be completed and present on the transcript from Suffolk County Community College at the time the student files a SUNY application. Some majors require a GPA higher than 2.0 for entry into the major. Major course requirements for the bachelor's degree will be those in effect at the time the student formally registers at SUNY Buffalo State College.

Section II Student Academic Advisement

Suffolk County Community College will assume responsibility for coordinating advisement for students who participate in the articulation agreement. The transfer course equivalency table (TABS) <http://admissions.buffalostate.edu/TABS> will be used as the mechanism for communicating course equivalencies to students. All admissions, pre-requisites, and major course requirements are listed under the respective program in the college catalog:

Programs and course equivalencies will be reviewed annually. Appropriate revisions will be made if either institution adds, deletes, or changes course offerings and/or programs.

New students are strongly encouraged to contact the department of their intended major at SUNY Buffalo State College prior to registration for their first full-time semester. Upon request, SUNY Buffalo State College will provide on-site support to Suffolk County Community College students.

Section III General Education Requirements

Students who intend to transfer to SUNY Buffalo State College with an A.A. or A.S. degree, will be considered as having fulfilled general education/Intellectual Foundations as long as they complete the 30 credits and 7 of 10 areas of SUNY-GER requirements prior to the start of their studies at SUNY Buffalo State College. Students should have successfully completed the SUNY-GER Basic Communication requirement with a grade of "C" or better, the mathematics

requirement, and 5 of the remaining 8 categories. The student is responsible for fulfilling the SUNY Buffalo State College Diversity requirement.

Section IV Transfer Services

All new students are required to attend orientation prior to the beginning of the fall or spring semester. Information regarding transfer student orientation and summer advisement sessions can be found at: <http://orientation.buffalostate.edu/> .

Housing will be available for students from Suffolk County Community College who request to live on-campus. Students who wish to reside on campus will be required to submit the housing deposit by June 1st for the fall semester and will be billed for the spring semester at the time of spring registration. 
Section V Time Frame and Provisions for Program Review





Art Education	3.0 overall GPA and SAT/ACT scores, 3.0 GPA in major/Art courses (includes AED, DES, FAR courses) (portfolio review by department)
Arts and Letters	Needs interview by the Assistant Dean of Arts & Humanities
Business Marketing Education	3.0 GPA and SAT/ACT/GRE/MAT scores – Exam waivers may be applied. See Education department for more information.
Business Administration	2.5 GPA and "C" or better in: credit bearing Math, CWP101 and 102 (equivalents)
Pre-Childhood Educ (Elementary Education)	3.0 GPA and SAT/ACT/GRE/MAT scores – Exam waivers may be applied. See Education department for more information.
Computer Information Systems	2.5 overall GPA and 2.0 in major courses; "C" or better in a programming course such as C, Pascal, Cobol, or Fortran, or the equivalent of CIS 151; DEPARTMENT REVIEWS
Criminal Justice	2.5 overall GPA plus 12 credits of college level coursework
Communication Design	2.0 GPA. Art test is required.
Design majors: Ceramics, Fibers, Metals/Jewelry, Wood/Furniture	2.0 GPA. Highly recommend that transfers contact the department prior to first semester for proper placement into courses. Students enter the corresponding BS program and do a portfolio review for admission into the BFA program.
Dietetics	Transfers need minimum of 2.75 GPA (some chemistry courses recommended) (Transfers go into Didactic program)
English Education	3.0 GPA and SAT/ACT/GRE/MAT scores – Exam waivers may be applied. See Education department for more information.
Exceptional Education	3.0 GPA and SAT/ACT/GRE/MAT scores – Exam waivers may be applied. See Education department for more information.
Family and Consumer Science Education	3.0 GPA and SAT/ACT/GRE/MAT scores – Exam waivers may be applied. See Education department for more information.
Forensic Chemistry	Students need to have completed CHE 111 and 112 or the equivalent with a C or better. Otherwise if they have a 2.0 GPA, but not the CHE requirements, and fewer than 30 credits, they go into the "Pre" program (FRCW). Transfers with more than 30 credit hours and no chemistry should go into CHE program.
French Education	Students should initially enroll in French Language and Literature
Health and Wellness	2.5 cumulative GPA
Individualized Studies	2.3 GPA and completed supplemental application. Students must expect to complete a minimum of 36 credits in major
Industrial Technology	2.0 GPA with background in Technical Science or Mathematics area
Interior Design	2.0 GPA. Transfer students should contact the department prior to first semester for proper placement into courses. Dependent on portfolio review during interview with department. Transcripts are case-by-case.
Music	Audition, interview, essay on 'most influential teacher' required.
Music Education	3.0 GPA and SAT/ACT scores. Audition required.
Painting	Portfolio review and interview by department required.
Photography	Portfolio review by department required.
Physics (B.S.)	All Physics transfers will go into the B.S. degree (BS-NS/PHY). Department does NOT recommend anyone go into the B.A. degree. Math prep through Algebra II/Trig (or Pre Calc) required
Physics Education	Should initially enroll in B.S. Physics program.
Printmaking	Portfolio review by department required.
Sculpture	Portfolio review by department required.
Social Studies-Secondary Education	3.0 GPA and SAT/ACT/GRE/MAT scores – Exam waivers may be applied. See Education department for more information.

Social Work	2.5 overall GPA and minimum of 45 credit hours to include CWP101, CWP102, BIO 101 (Human Bio), SOC 100 (Intro Soc) and PSY 101 (Intro Psych)
Spanish Education	Student should initially enroll in Spanish Language and Literature
Speech Language Pathology	3.0 overall GPA and 60 credit hours at time of enrollment.
Television and Film Arts	Letter of recommendation, submission of creative work required. Reviewed by TFA Advisory Committee.
Writing	2.5 minimum GPA, completion of Basic Writing requirement and portfolio/writing sample to be reviewed by department are required.
